Excite your students by displaying a consistent and authentic enthusiasm for learning, their school, and their community.

Nurture your students by getting to know who they are as individuals. Discover what type of affirmation they need to understand that they are valued and valuable, and provide them with what they need to feel valued and valuable.

Guard your students from harm. Do your best to prevent them from experiencing physical and emotional injury in all circumstances.

Allow your students to be themselves. Celebrate their personalities and create an environment where they feel safe to express their thoughts and interests. Create an atmosphere where students are comfortable with making mistakes and learning from them.

Grow your students by being a role model. Applaud good citizenship and show equal respect to all students and everyone who steps into your school. Turn everyday struggles into growth lessons whenever possible.

Encourage your students with genuine and meaningful words on a regular basis. Make it your daily objective to improve each student's day with encouragement that is thoughtful and sincere.
